Statistical Communication: What's the Norm?



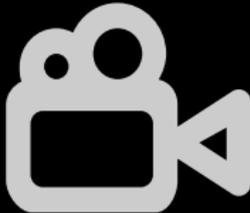
- Good for specialists

- Engagement opportunities
- Pause/rewind/speed up/slow down
- Increased accessibility (captioning, descriptions, links)

Tips on Creating Accessible Videos

Basic Principles:

- Keep them short!
- It's okay/necessary to compromise on detail.
- Above all: Don't let perfect be the enemy of good!
